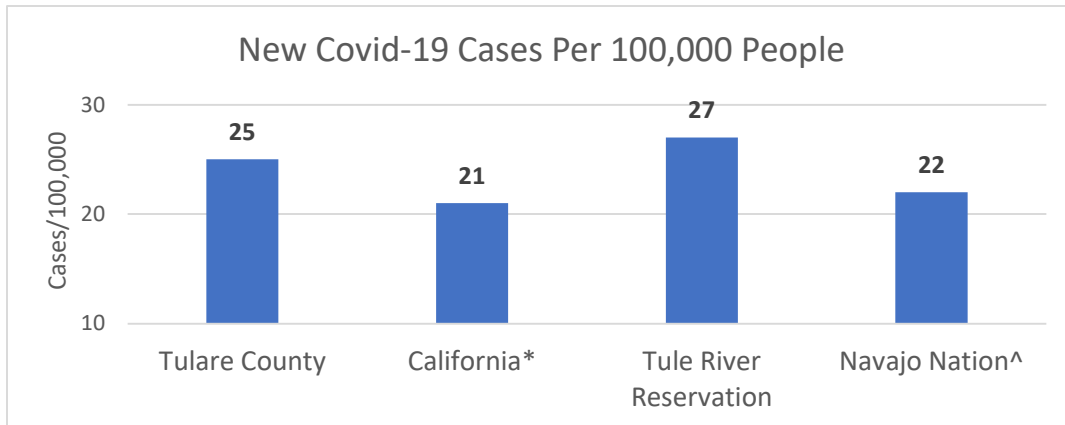
- 3 new positive cases in the last week on the Tule River Indian Reservation, which is our lowest rate since November
- 24 active cases on the Tule River Indian Reservation, which has decreased from our peak of over 50 cases in January
- PHA continues to ask residents to **STAY AT HOME** unless out for essential activities

Off Reservation: **2**



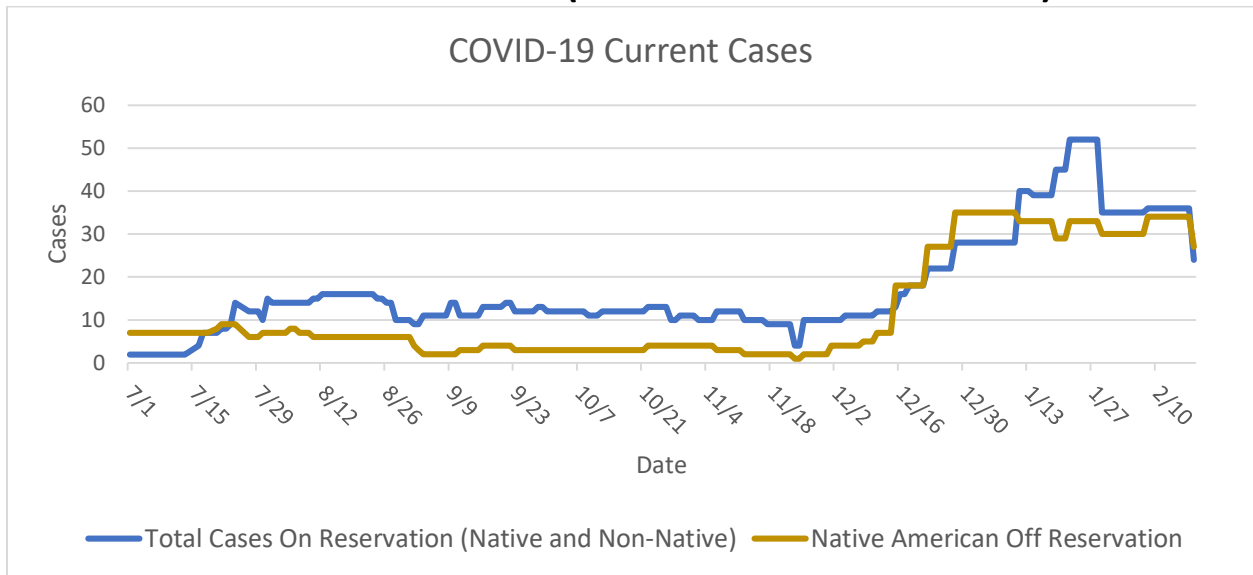
“New cases” are everyone who tests positive for Covid-19 for the first time within the last 7 days. The graph below compares the rate of new cases with other areas.

Active Cases

Active Positive Cases: 51 (24 on & 27 off reservation)



“Active cases” are everyone that currently has Covid-19 on the reservation. This number is different from new cases because active cases may have first tested positive more than a week ago. New cases are only those that have tested positive within the last week.

Cumulative Cases

Cumulative Positive Cases*: 359 (181 on & 178 off reservation)
Recovered:† 307 (156 on & 151 off reservation)
Deaths: 1

Cumulative cases are all cases of Covid-19 diagnosed at the Tule River Indian Health Center of residents of the reservation or other patients of the center.

Quarantine

Number in Quarantine: 65 (45 on & 20 off reservation)

Quarantined individuals are those with a known direct exposure to a positive case of Covid-19. They are ordered to stay within their residence or another facility for up to 14 days.

* Total Cases include all residents of the Tule River Indian Reservation and Native non-residents

† Recovered includes those that are or lost to follow-up and have been released with doctor’s permission.
